## Why are we consulting?

## We want our Island to be the best place in the country to live and work.

The Isle of Wight Council has been run by a group of "Independent" councillors since the last local government elections in May 2013. Nearly three years into their term of office the Council is:

- bottom of national league tables for adult care
- bottom of South East Region school league tables
- failing to secure grant funding from the Solent Local Enterprise Partnership
- slashing services
- closing more toilets
- abolishing free parking periods
- making front line and backroom staff redundant
- out of its depth in managing the important contract with Island Roads
- failing to engage with the business community
- lacking vision and innovation in economic development
- squandering cash reserves

Many so-called "Independent" councillors were elected on the "Framework for Change" Manifesto making many promises. That Manifesto is now in tatters with almost all its pledges abandoned. Three councillors have left the "Independent" Group, disillusioned with its failures.

## The current Leadership lacks strategic vision. It is rudderless and is failing.

We take no delight in this situation; we too live on the Island with our families and friends. We share the deep concern of Island residents about the direction of travel under the current Council Leadership.

The next elections are in May 2017. The Conservative Group of Councillors are determined to provide clear leadership unlike the current dysfunctional administration at County Hall. We want a real conversation with Island residents. That conversation is not about us telling you what we will do if we are elected at the next election. It is about asking you what your priorities are, how we can help individuals and businesses on the Island achieve their full potential; what we can do, together, to grow the economy and create jobs, to help make the Island a better place to live and work.

We will not make promises we cannot deliver. We will stand by our commitments. We will work together for the common good of the Island.
